


The Park spans 20,000 sqm and the cost of building it amounted to AED22 million. It serves as a prime tourist destination as it is a natural reserve.




The Park is home to all kinds of crocodiles, including the Nile crocodiles, which are the largest freshwater species.










Danger of extinction
