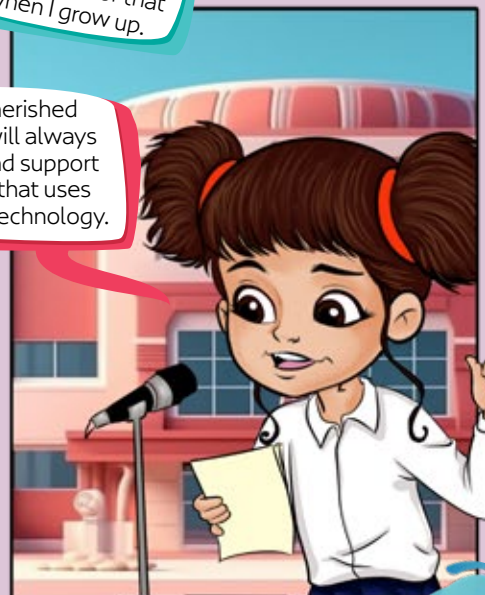


The National Programme for Coders aims to train 100,000 coders and launch 1,000 mega digital companies in the next five years.

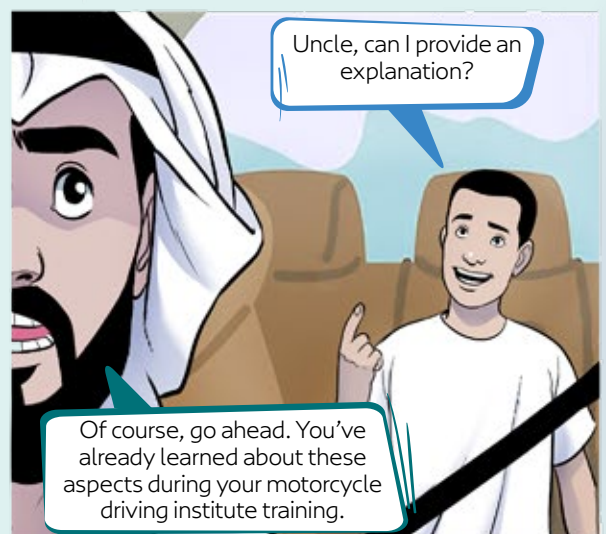
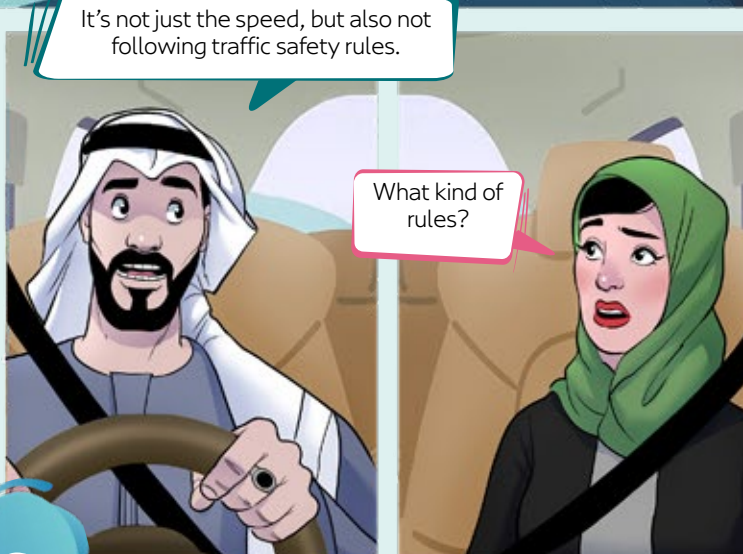
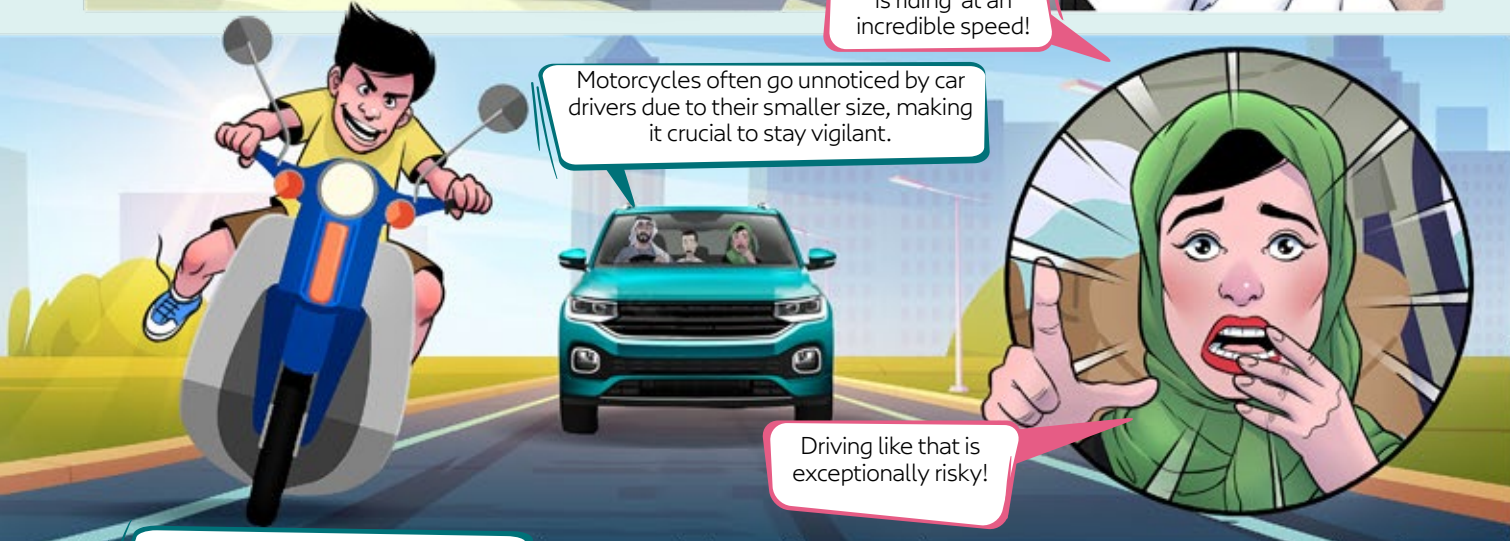

The mission is the longest space mission in Arab history

The United Arab Emirates has celebrated the triumphant return of its citizen Sultan Al Neyadi, who accomplished the longest space mission in Arab history, "Ambition Zayed 2"—a landmark expedition spanning six months. His homecoming was marked with the reception of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the UAE, and His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President, Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai.



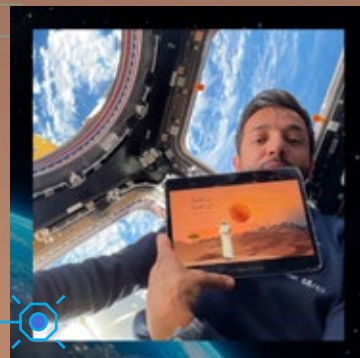
Great Example for the Youth of the Nation

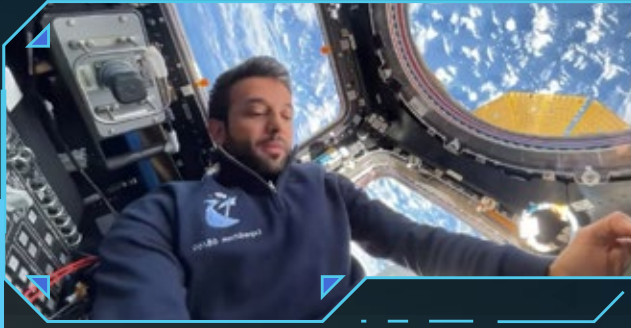
Their Highnesses extended warm congratulations to Sultan Al Neyadi on his safe return to the homeland after accomplishing the longest space mission in Arab history. They stressed that he had set an inspiring example for the youth of the nation and the achievement of ambitions. With young men and women like Sultan, the state's flag will continue to fly high, which is what the leadership always aspires to achieve.



From the Desert to Space

A pioneering book "From the Desert to Space," penned by His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, was inaugurated aboard the International Space Station, a first in the world. This book shares insightful memories and serves as a beacon, enlightening millions of young minds about turning points in the UAE's progressive journey. Sultan Al Neyadi recited excerpts linking the realms of space and thought in a timeless conversation.





Astronaut Career

In December 2017, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum via the “X” platform (previously known as Twitter), “I invite the nation’s youth to enlist in the Emirates Astronaut Program through the Mohammed bin Rashid Space Centre, with a promise that the most exceptional and qualified would represent as the ambassadors of space.” Sultan Al Neyadi was one of the chosen two from a pool of 4,022 applicants after passing rigorous mental and physical evaluations conducted in both the UAE and Russia.

Sultan Al Neyadi completed his secondary education in Umm Ghafa and went on to earn a Bachelor’s degree in Electronics and Communications Engineering from the University of Brighton in the United Kingdom. He joined Zayed Military College for one year and worked as a telecommunications Engineer in the UAE Armed Forces. He obtained a Master’s degree in Information and Network Security from Griffith University in Australia and earned a Doctorate in Data Leakage Prevention Technology from the same institution.

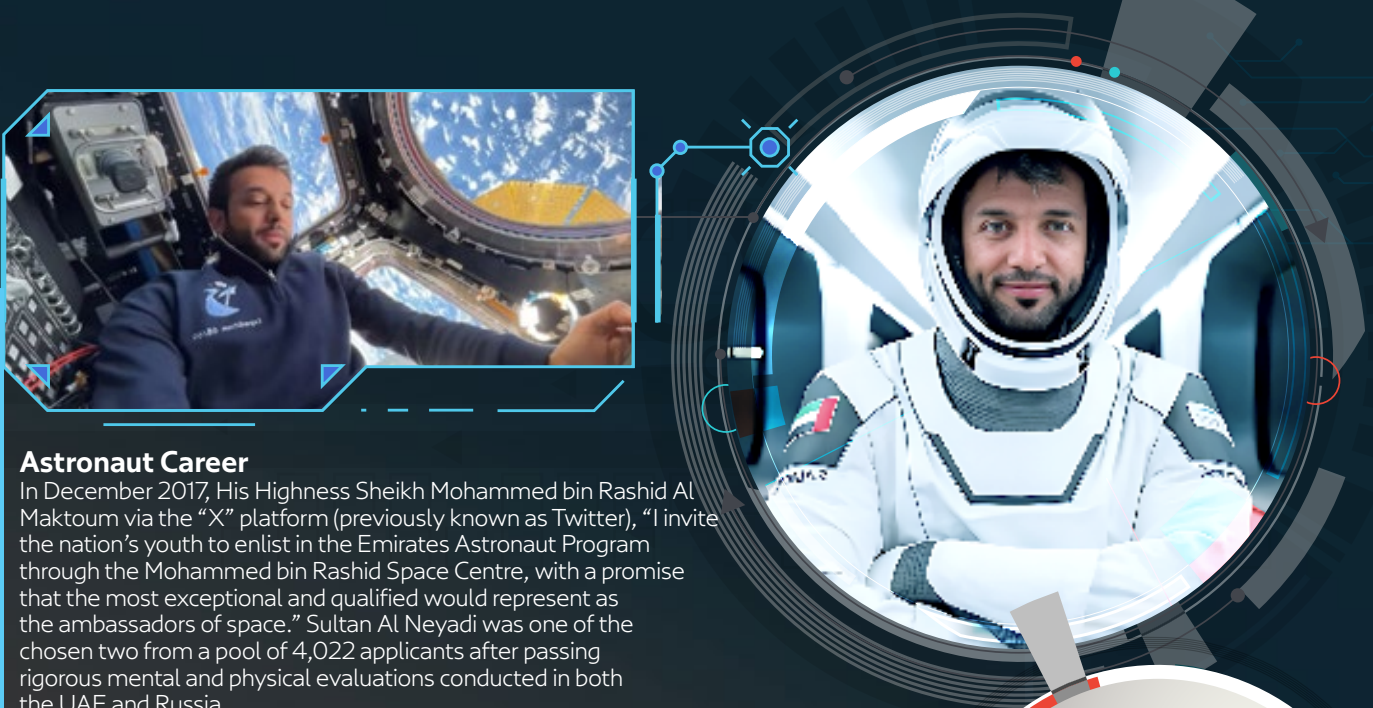


Missing the Nation

Before heading back to Earth, Al Neyadi shared his deep longing for his cherished homeland, the UAE, mentioning his eagerness to get back items from space for his children, to bring them joy and happiness, after being away from them for over 6 months. He mentioned that he craved the meals his mom used to prepare, noting that they were distinctly different from the food designated for astronauts.

Suhail

The doll, named Suhail, journeyed with Al Neyadi into space. It was established by the Mohammed bin Rashid Space Centre, to inspire youth and children with science and technology. Taking its name from the second most luminous star in the sky, the Suhail Star, this doll made its inaugural journey to the International Space Station in 2019, in the company of Emirati astronaut Hazza Al Mansouri.



Childhood Dream to become an astronaut

Born on May 23, 1981, in the village of Umm Ghafa in the city of Al Ain, Sultan Al Neyadi learned the principles of discipline early in life from his father, a dedicated trainer in the UAE Air Force. As a child, Sultan used to watch the stars and the moon and dreamed of being an astronaut when he grew up.

SpaceX Crew 6 Mission

Al Neyadi’s aspirations reached fruition on March 2, 2023, as he embarked on the historic SpaceX Crew 6 mission, marking the longest space mission in Arab history. This six-month journey aboard the International Space Station culminated in his return to Earth on September 4, 2023.

Milestone Achievement

On April 28, 2023, Sultan Al Neyadi made a historic achievement for the UAE and the Arab world, becoming the first Arab to undertake an extravehicular activity (spacewalk) mission. During his groundbreaking journey aboard the International Space Station, Al Neyadi contributed to around 200 scientific experiments.

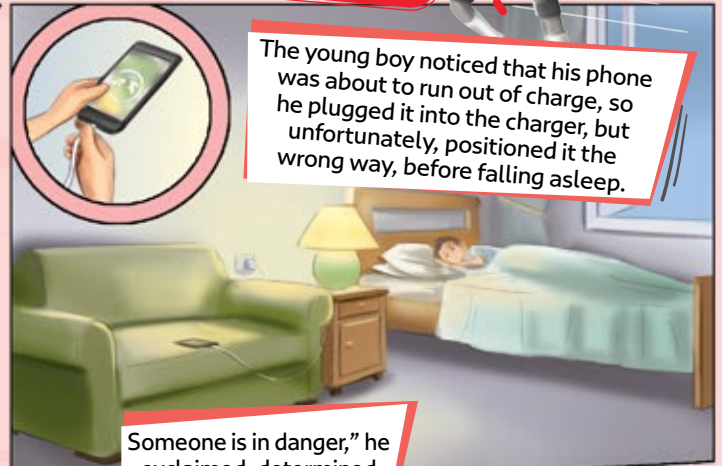

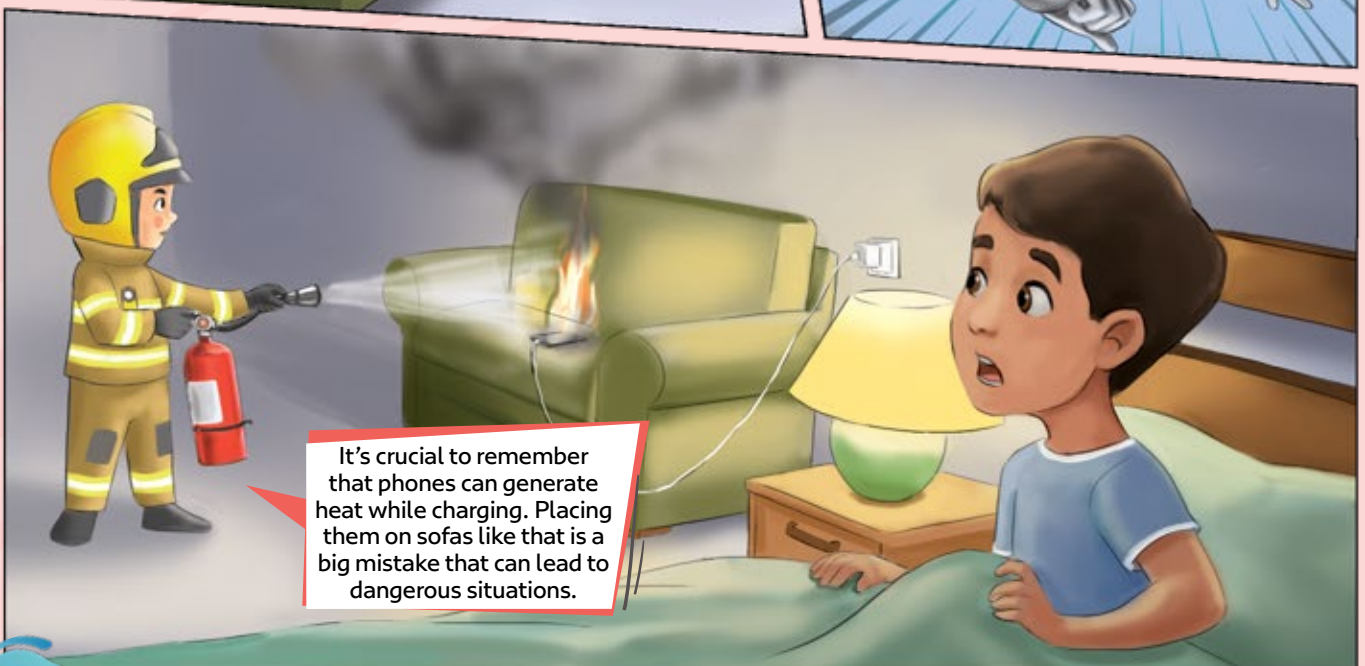


The young boy noticed that his phone was about to run out of charge, so he plugged it into the charger, but unfortunately, positioned it the wrong way, before falling asleep.

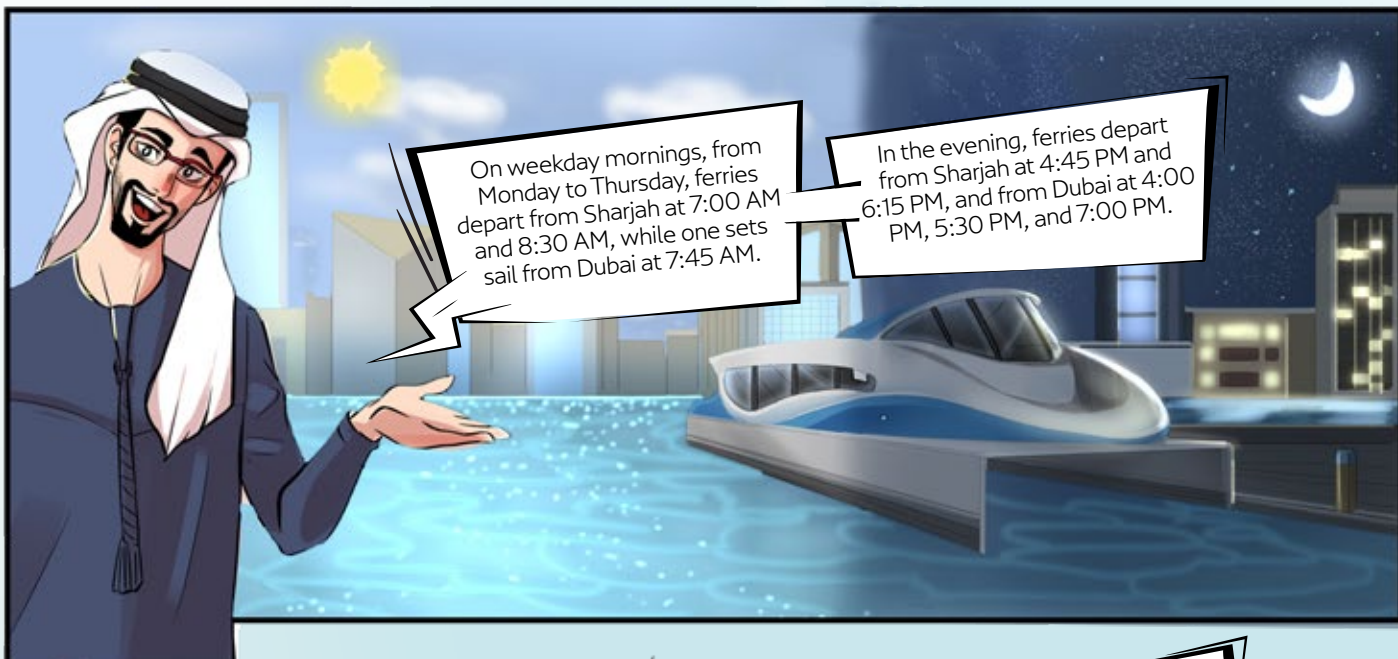


Commuting between Dubai and Sharjah by sea is a time saving journey

In the evening, ferries depart from Sharjah at 4:45 PM and 6:15 PM, and from Dubai at 4:00 PM, 5:30 PM, and 7:00 PM.



The ferry offers all amenities for a safe and comfortable journey. You can book using a nol card, at the ticket counter, or online.



Tickets are priced at 15 dirhams for silver class and 25 dirhams for gold. It's free for people of determination and kids below 5 years old.

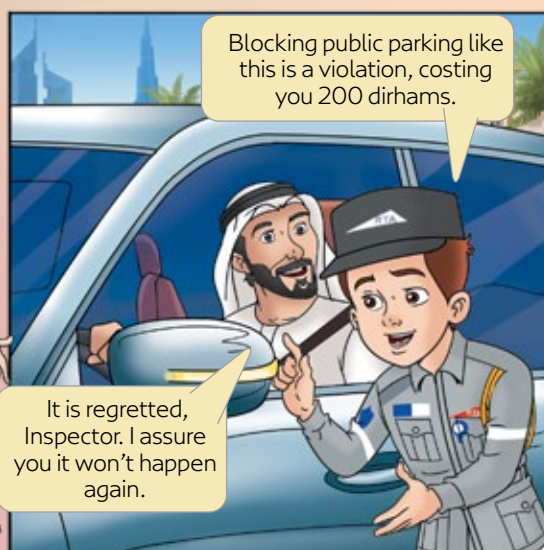

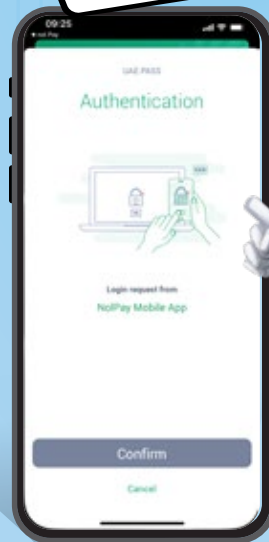
RTA launched New version of nol Pay app

In sign language, representing an entire year involves placing the index finger near the mouth in this way.

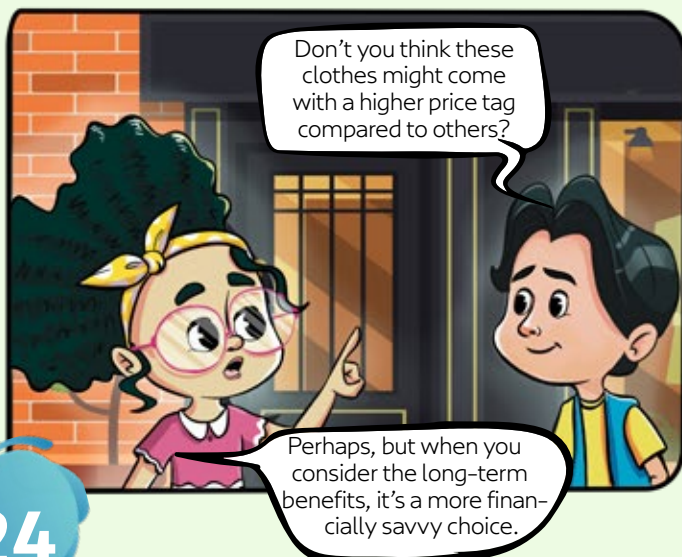
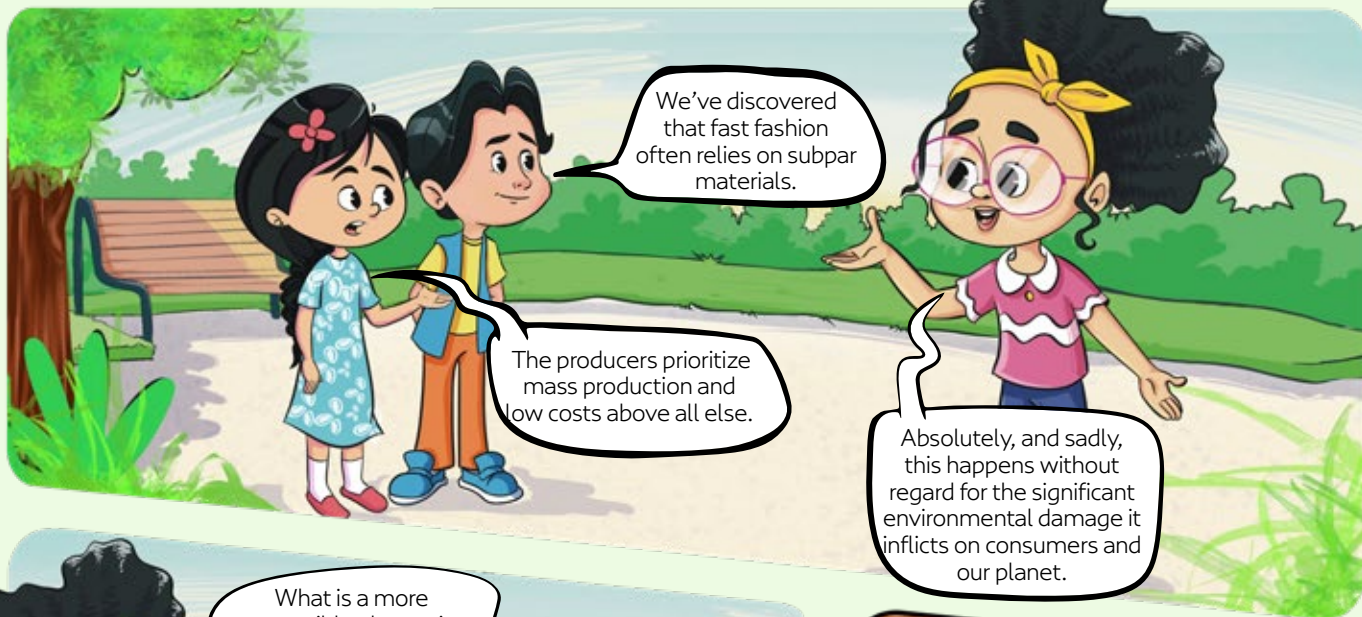

Besides avoiding throwing unwanted clothes in the garbage.

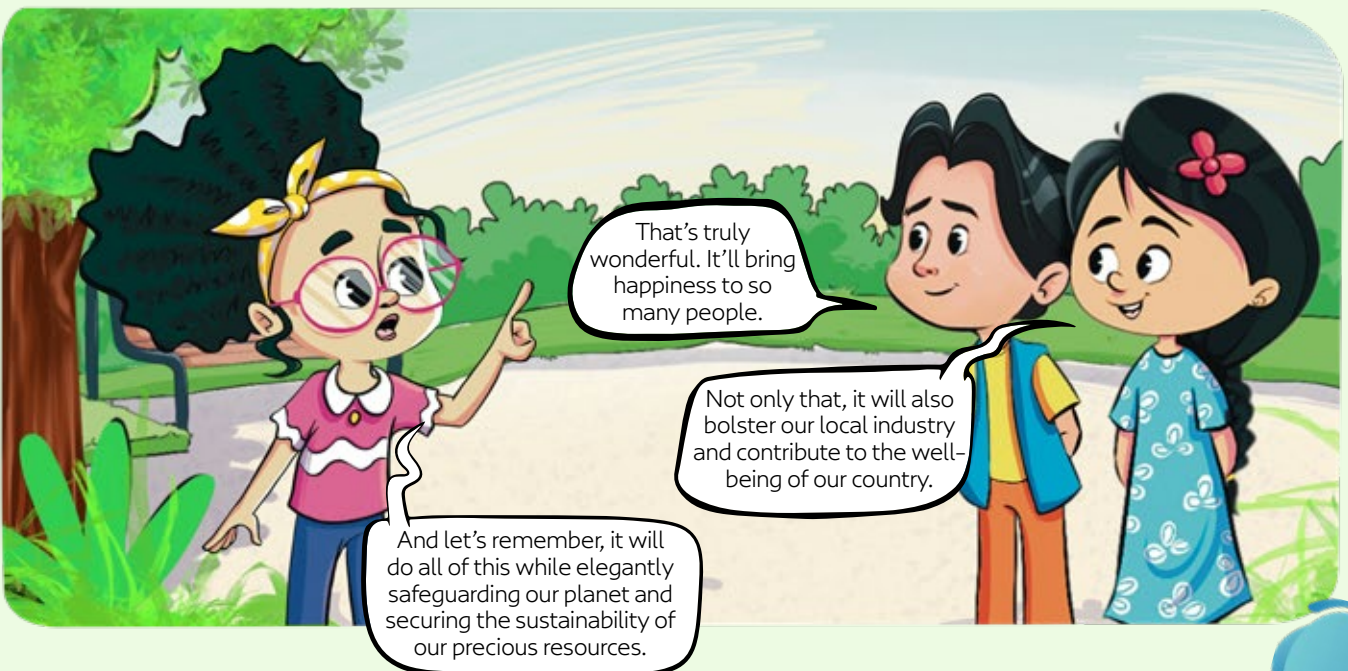
