

Executive Council Resolution No. (45) of 2013
Concerning
Provision of Electricity through the
Street Lighting Network of the Roads and Transport Authority¹

We, Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai, Chairman of the Executive Council,

After perusal of:

Law No. (3) of 2003 Establishing the Executive Council of the Emirate of Dubai;

Law No. (17) of 2005 Establishing the Roads and Transport Authority (the "RTA");

Law No. (14) of 2009 Concerning the Pricing of Government Services in the Emirate of Dubai;

Law No. (35) of 2009 Concerning Management of the Public Funds of the Government of Dubai and its amendments;

Decree No. (1) of 1992 Establishing the Dubai Electricity and Water Authority and its amendments; and

Executive Council Resolution No. (16) of 2011 Approving the Electricity and Water Tariff in the Emirate of Dubai,

Do hereby issue this Resolution.

Rules Governing Electricity Supply
Article (1)

- a. The RTA may provide any entity with electricity supply from the street, bridge, and tunnel lighting network in accordance with the following conditions and rules:
1. The electricity supply application must be submitted to the RTA. This application must contain the name of the requesting entity; the purpose for which the electricity supply is required; the expected electrical load; the location where the electricity supply will be provided; and any other information determined by the RTA.

2. The provision of electricity supply must be in conformity with the relevant standards, plans, and no-objection certificates issued by the Dubai Electricity and Water Authority in respect of the electrical loads approved for the location where the electricity supply will be provided.
 3. The electricity supply must be used exclusively for roadside advertising and for providing services on the road and its right of way.
 4. The provision of electricity supply must not compromise the safety of the Public Electricity Network and must satisfy public safety requirements.
 5. The requesting entity must undertake to pay compensation for any damage to the electricity network or to third parties as a result of using the electricity supply.
- b. An entity that is provided with the electricity supply in accordance with this Resolution will be charged the following:
1. The charge for electricity consumption as per the Electricity Tariff prescribed by the Dubai Electricity and Water Authority for the RTA. Electricity consumption will be measured based on the electricity load and period requested by that entity;
 2. an administrative and supervisory fee of twenty-five percent (25%) of the electricity consumption charges referred to in paragraph (1)(b) of this Article, where this entity is a private entity; and
 3. any other costs arising prior or after provision of the electricity supply for this entity.

Payment of Revenues Article (2)

The revenue collected pursuant to this Resolution will be paid to the Public Treasury of the Government of Dubai.

Publication and Commencement Article (3)

This Resolution will be published in the Official Gazette and will come into force on the day on which it is published.
