RTA mandates contractors and suppliers with whom we have substantial involvement, to conform to RSEMS requirements. RTA will inform business partners of these Policies, Systems and Protocols and work with them where appropriate to support their adoption of practices as a minimum to comply with RTA's Strategic Goal to achieve 'Safety and Environmental Sustainability' by incorporating strategies, policies and SOPs that promote the Health and Safety stewardship of our personnel, contractors and passengers throughout all our business and operational activities.


Drivers for Occupational Health and Safety in RTA



Health and Safety Governance Model

Our safety governance structure is based on the principles of leadership, participation, risk management, stakeholder engagement and legislative compliance. In order to achieve structured and meaningful impact, management responsible for executing safety decisions is spread across various teams and personnel. Our formal joint health and safety structure consists of top management, senior management and team members.



Compliance assessment and Status

RTA's Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) governance framework is in alignment with the RSEMS policy. The RTA Safety & Environmental Management System (RSEMS) ensures compliance to international standards and other applicable best practices and is implemented across the entire operations and integrates other systems and standards to meet RTA's health and safety objectives and targets.

RTA conducts regular and periodic audits and inspections across its operations to ensure compliance to OHS policies, obligations and standard requirements. RTA confirms compliance with legal and other obligations mandated by relevant legal authorities. No prohibition notice or noncompliance report was raised on RTA in 2017, 2018 & 2019 with respect to the OHS legal obligations.

RTA's Occupational Health and Safety compliance is assessed through different programmes, as follows:

- Compliance Assessment by Legal Authorities No external non-compliance raised in 2017, 2018 & 2019
- Compliance Audits by the Certification Body Meeting the expectations and requirements.
 As well as retaining the Certifications granted to RTA in 2017, 2018 & 2019
- Audits and inspections by the Safety, Risk, Regulation & Planning Department 100% adherence to Audit Plan in 2017, 2018 & 2019
- Audits and inspections by the QHSE Offices in operational agencies
- Assessment by the Internal Audit Department in Director General Office

In the period of 2017, 2018 & 2019 RTA has achieved and assured legal compliance required by the management system procedure – RSEMS, legal and other requirements.






Incident Statistics 2017, 2018 & 2019




Rate of recordable work-related injuries 2017, 2018 & 2019




Equivalent Fatalities 2017, 2018 & 2019




Equivalent Fatality Rate - 2017





Agencies

AbdulMohsin Ibrahim Younes

Chief Executive Officer, Rail Agency

Rail Agency has an impressive track record in the implementation of safety standards in the rail projects (Dubai Metro and Dubai Tram) in line with world-class standards.

The projects have recorded a safety level better than the acceptable global rate of one accident per million working hours. RTA adopted the highest standards of rail safety and has signed several agreements and MoUs with global entities such as ORR and Imperial College in the UK, SMRT in Singapore and others.

Rail Agency proudly celebrated the 10th Year of successful Dubai Metro operations in September 2019 with more than 2.5 million safe trips carrying over 1.6 billion passengers. The growth of Dubai Metro has been one of the Middle East's most extraordinary success stories, considering one of the most efficient, safest and cleanest metro systems in the world.

RTA's recent membership in the Community of Metros (COMET) demonstrated Dubai Metros performance as compared to 38 Metros in the world. In terms of the Overall Equivalent Fatalities (i.e. Measure of Fatalities+ Major Injuries+ Minor Injuries per passenger journeys), a measure which is used to measure safety performance, the results are as follows; Dubai Metro is 4th best in terms of safety record after Seoul, Guangzhou and Singapore. The punctuality rate is at an average of 99.71 per cent with near zero crime and vandalism.

Rail Agency also proudly celebrated the 5th Year of successful Dubai Tram operations, which is one of the most advanced tram systems in the world with state-of-the-art safety technology as Aesthetic Power Supply (APS) and fully air-conditioned Tram Stations.

In terms of the future of Railways, Dubai Metro Red Line extension (Route 2020) is in the final testing and commissioning phase. The construction works have been completed without any fatality. Furthermore, Route 2020 achieved a major milestone of 24 million-man hours without Loss Time Injury (LTI).



Traffic and Road Agency is responsible for design, construction and maintenance of road networks in the Emirate of Dubai. Even though the risk involved in the building and maintaining a world class infrastructure is tremendously high, we thoroughly follow the policy that Safety of a person overrides all construction and maintenance targets. We strongly always believe in promoting occupational health & safety across agency's business at all times and committed to protect our employees, stakeholders and the community around us without compromising their wellbeing.





Ahmed Hashem Bahrozyan

Chief Executive Officer, Public Transport Agency

Land and marine public transport operated by PTA have demonstrated a positive trend in safety performance for the last 9 years. The accident rate of public bus operations has reduced from 1.05 in 2010 to 0.32 in 2019. During the last 3 years, ZERO fatalities were reported in public bus operation. Also, ZERO fatalities were reported in marine transport for the last 10 years. Marine transport has now completed 1 million manhours without any injuries to passengers and crew. This performance needs to be sustained, which needs efforts from all stakeholders.

We have established many initiatives that will improve the safety of transport mode, which we operate or regulate. In addition, we are constantly upgrading the facilities to improve the work environment. We believe that safer public transport is a key aspect required for increasing ridership.

The health and safety of our employees, and of all our stakeholders, is our fundamental objective. We continually seek to improve all aspects of our safety performance. I chair the safety committee of PTA with all directors as its members and we meet regularly to discuss safety issues. This signifies our commitment and approach in ensuring safety compliance.

It is not just, about what we say, but about what we do on the ground at our operations every day.



Chief Executive Officer, Licensing Agency

We make concerted efforts to improve the driver's performance and vehicle safety in order to reduce road related injuries, accidents, CO2 emission reduction and deaths within the Emirate. We work in coordination with strategic partners that include Dubai Police, driver training institutes and vehicle inspection stations. We collaborate with operated customer service centres, approved agent operators and e-service channels to deliver the best quality service. Our agency contains five departments, which are: – Vehicles Licensing – Drivers Training and Qualification – Drivers licensing – Monitoring and Enforcement, Commercial Transport Activities.



Dr.Eng. Yousif Al Ali

Chief Executive Officer, Dubai Taxi Corporation

In order to achieve DTC vision "Pioneers in Safe, Reliable and Smart Transport Services", DTC introduced a package of traffic safety-driven programs, initiatives and projects. For instance, it has introduced the Brake Plus system in DTC taxicabs where a four-way flasher system automatically operates once the driver applies the brake to slow down or suddenly stop, in order to minimise the chances of rear side collisions. It has also put a 120 km/h speed limit on highways to all taxicabs of DTC, and identified geographical spots witnessing recurrent accidents to analyze the causes and introduce remedial measures. DTC has launched a driver monitoring system via on board cameras to spot events of declining attentiveness or sudden sleeping of taxi drivers to avoid potential accidents.



As result of these series of programmes & initiatives, DTC has reduced the taxi accident rate from 0.61 accidents per 100 thousand km in 2009 to 0.25 accidents per 100 thousand km in 2019, as evidence of DTC efforts in contributing to traffic safety in Dubai and the realisation of RTA's vision of "Safe & Smooth Transport for All" and the strategic goal No 5 "Safety and Environmental Sustainability.

DTC has developed new & sophisticated measures in training cabbies to sensitize them about the applicable rules & regulations as well as the importance of complying with the practices that maximise the safety & security of riders in support of RTA's vision. DTC has a unique system of incentives & rewards for motivating cabbies to improve the level of service. As part of its efforts to maintain the safety of customers and maximise their satisfaction. Beside that DTC has launched the Traffic Safety Award to felicitate distinguished drivers whose records are free from accidents, offences and quality violations".

Proactive Occupational Health and Safety Management

Roads and Transport Authority is committed to providing employees a safe working condition as far as is reasonable, practicable and has structured arrangements to ensure the safety and wellbeing of staff and others who may be affected by our activities. RTA's Safety Strategy is to minimise the adverse impacts to individuals and the business from ill health and injury. RTA has a robust HSE framework to manage OHS risks and their impact on stakeholders which include employees, contractors, visitors and other vulnerable categories of people (nursery students, people of determination, etc.), passengers, public, etc. RSEMS supports in the identification of key health and safety risks that must be managed at an agency level. This is supported by Corporate Audits & Inspections, Emergency Responses & Drills, activity-based risk assessments, project risk assessments, and threat and scenario-based risk assessments. This multi-tier platform supports in effectively managing RTA's Occupational Health and Safety risks that could have potential impacts on the organisation.

A formal process of reviewing health and safety performance exists across the organisation and is a crucial element of a robust safety management system. It allows the management teams to establish whether the essential health and safety principles are functioning within the organisation. Performance of sectors and agencies are monitored on a monthly basis. OHS performance data is collected, validated and consolidated for RSEMS OHS data management system. This system provides all management levels throughout RTA with necessary information to take early action if deviations from targets occur. Systems and processes are reviewed by third parties – in addition to corporate iAudits and agency QHSE audits.







RTA Safety Awards (2018 and 2019)

As a part of RTA's wider campaign to promote and recognise good practice in the field of safety, H. E. Mattar Al Tayer, Director General, Chairman of the Board of Executive Directors, RTA's Chairman of the Board and Executive Director, has instructed the initiation and establishment of an annual Safety Award in the year 2009.



The audits also measured RTA's HSE performance against a number of key best practice indicators.




3. Globe of Honor
